## 2023 Grantee Speaker



### Brad Gordon, Esq. BERKSHIRE COUNTY REGIONAL HOUSING AUTHORITY

#### Pittsfield, MA

An attorney and trained mediator and conciliator, Brad Gordon has served as the Executive Director and Staff Attorney for the Berkshire County Regional Housing Authority (BCRHA), where he administers housing counseling and homelessness prevention programs, for over 30 years. He has experience in housing law, poverty law, and alternative dispute resolution (ADR) and is the founder of BCRHA's Dispute Resolution Center. He also developed Berkshire County's first court connected mediation program.

In addition to his work with BCRHA, Brad serves on the Leadership Council of the Western Massachusetts Network to End Homelessness and the Citizens Housing and Planning Association. He sits on the Advisory Board of the Massachusetts Housing and Shelter Alliance and co-chairs both the Massachusetts Regional Housing Network's Public Policy Committee and the Three County Continuum of Care's Board. Brad previously served on the Berkshire Bar Association's ADR Committee, on the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court's Standing Committee on ADR, and on the Bench/Bar Committee of the Western Massachusetts Housing Court. He earned his BA from the University of Massachusetts and his JD from the University of Buffalo-School of Law.

Berkshire County Regional Housing Authority has been an MBF IOLTA Grantee since 1997. In that time, the organization has been awarded 28 grants totaling \$794,230.

Jeffrey Trapani is Of Counsel to Pierce Davis & Perritano LLP, where he concentrates in civil litigation, including insurance defense, employment law, municipal liability, business litigation, and professional malpractice. He also represents landlords in summary process action and housing discrimination claims and insurance companies in unfair settlement claims and coverage issues. Jeff often appears before the Federal and State Courts throughout Massachusetts, as well as various administrative agencies, including the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination. In addition to trial work, Jeff represents clients in mediations and arbitrations.

When he is not in the courtroom, Jeff has participated as a member of the Massachusetts Bar Association's (MBA) House of Delegates, as a member of the Standing Advisory Committee on the Rules of Civil and Appellate Procedure of the Supreme Judicial Court, as a Representative for Hampshire County Bar Association on the MBA's Joint Bar Committee on Judicial Appointments, and as a Hearing Officer for the Board of Bar Overseers. He has been an active member of the Legislative Steering Committee of the Springfield Chamber of Commerce, having served as Chairman.

Jeff earned his BA from Wake Forest University and his JD from New England School of Law. He is a Louis D. Brandeis Fellow of the MBF and has been a dedicated grant reviewer for the Western Mass. Regional Grant Advisory Committee.
